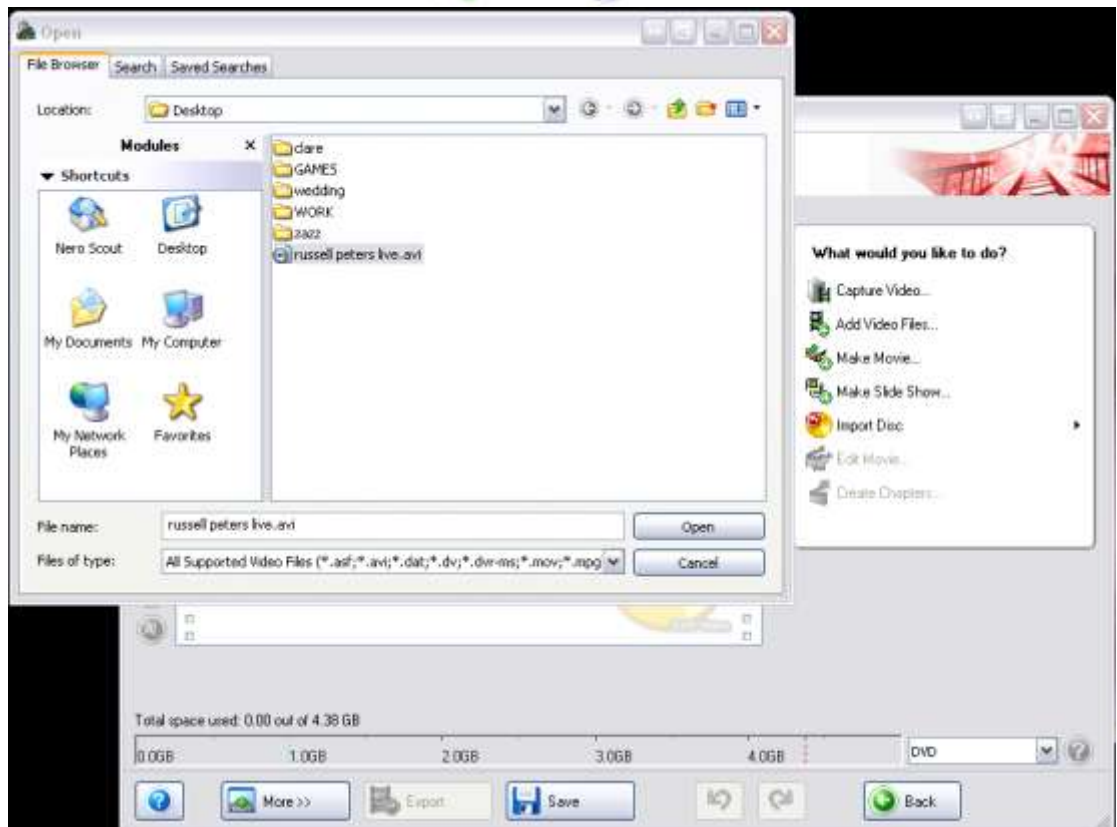
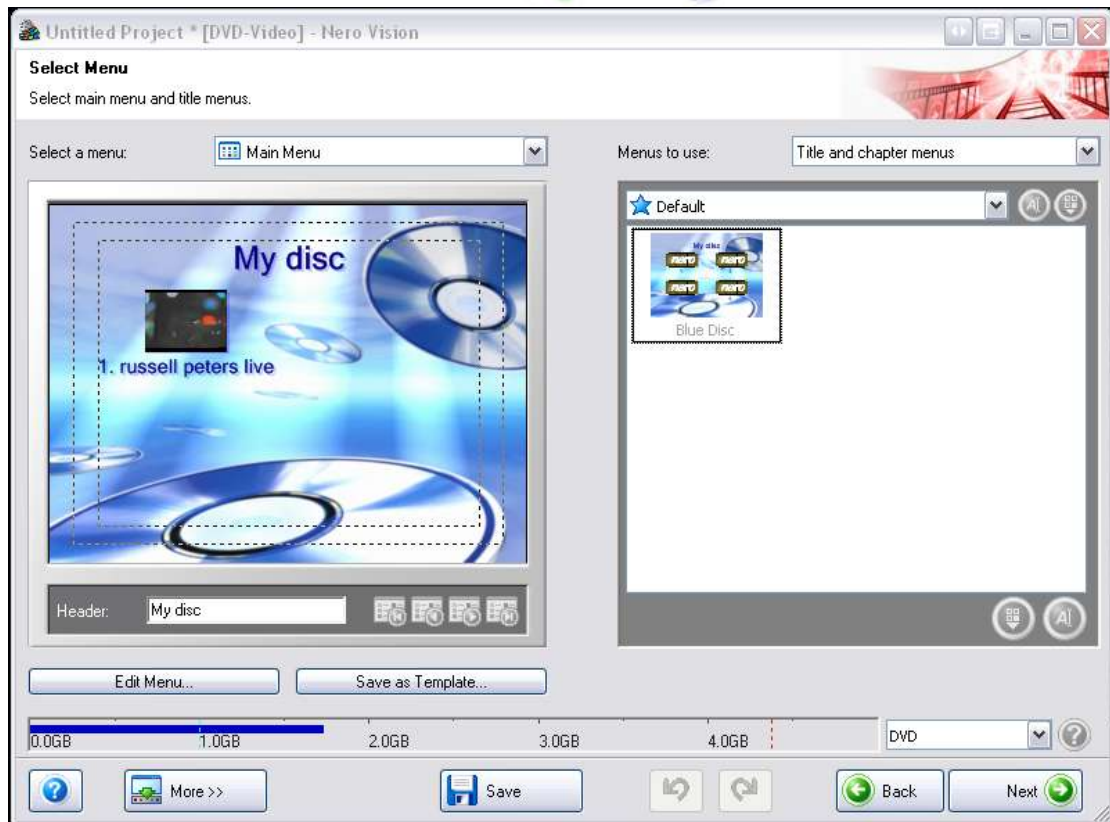




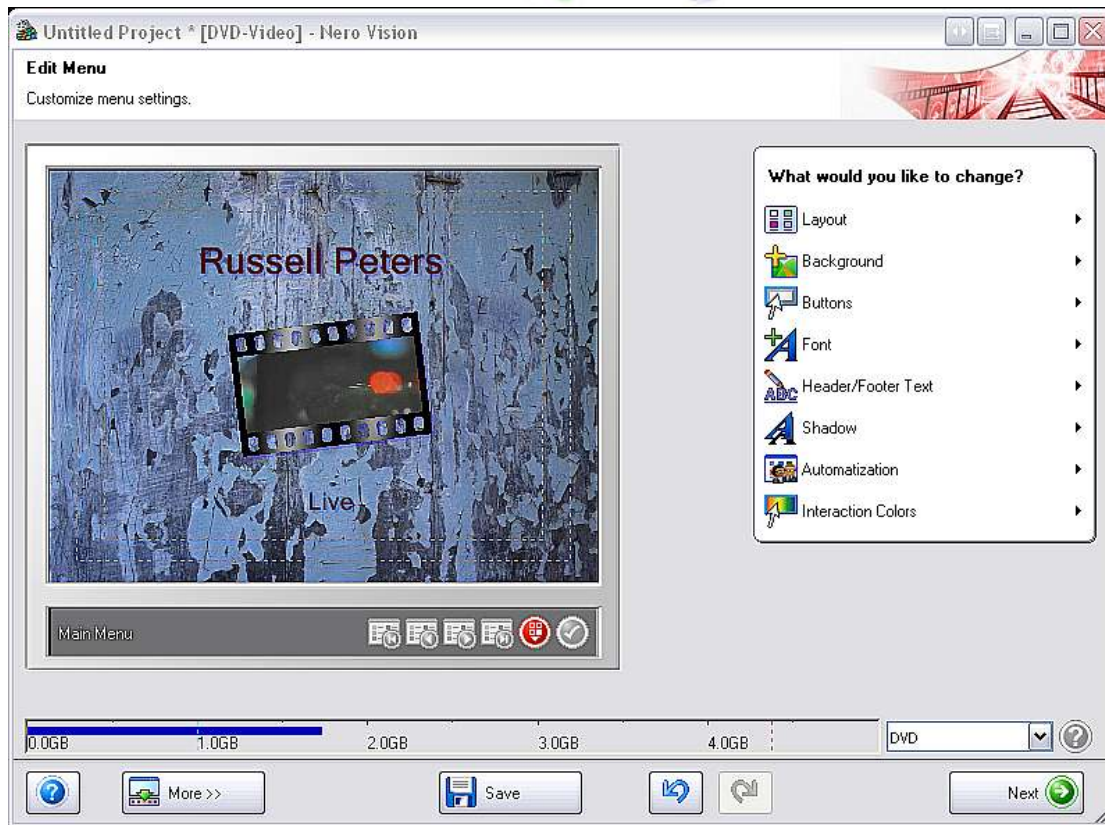
1. Open Nero StartSmart
2. Choose **Photo and Video**
3. Make your own **DVD-Video**
4. The following screen will pop up



1. Click on **Add Video Files**
2. Go to where you have store your already made MPEG (Movie Maker Movie)
3. Click on the file (eg: Russell peters live.avi)
4. **Open**
5. Click **Next**

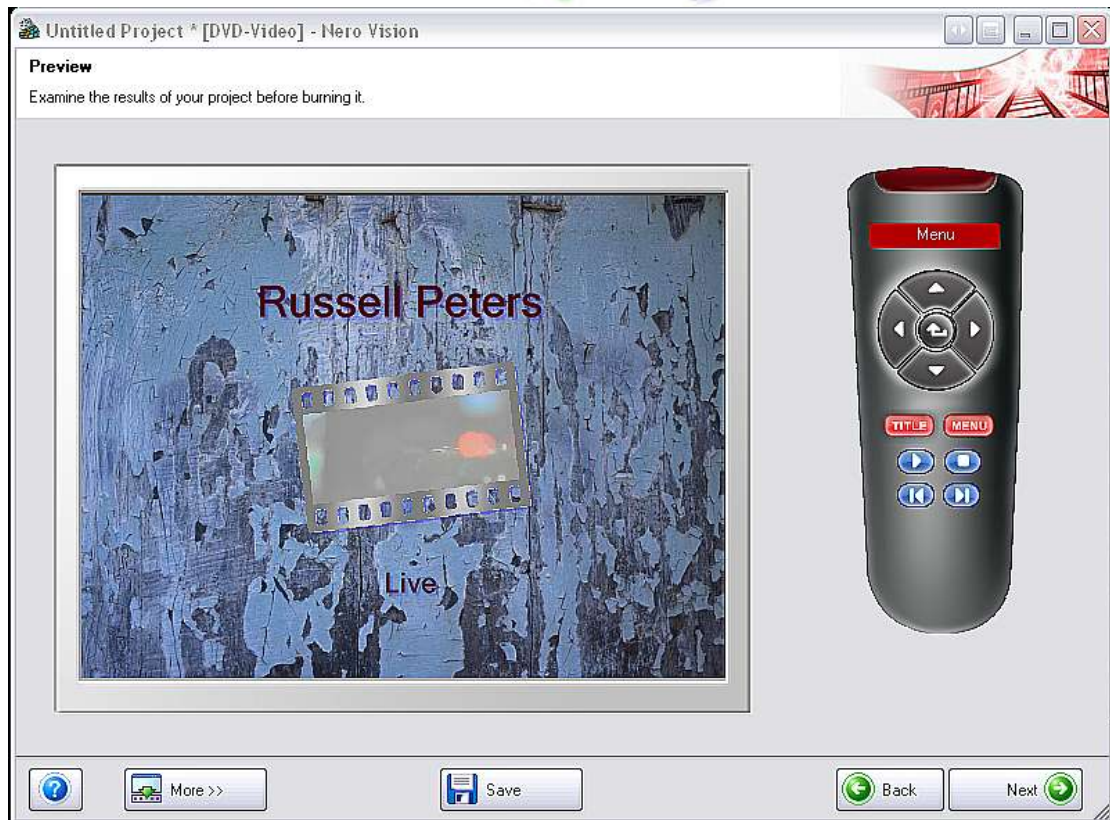


1. This screen will then pop up. This is where you edit your menu etc.
2. Click **Edit Menu**

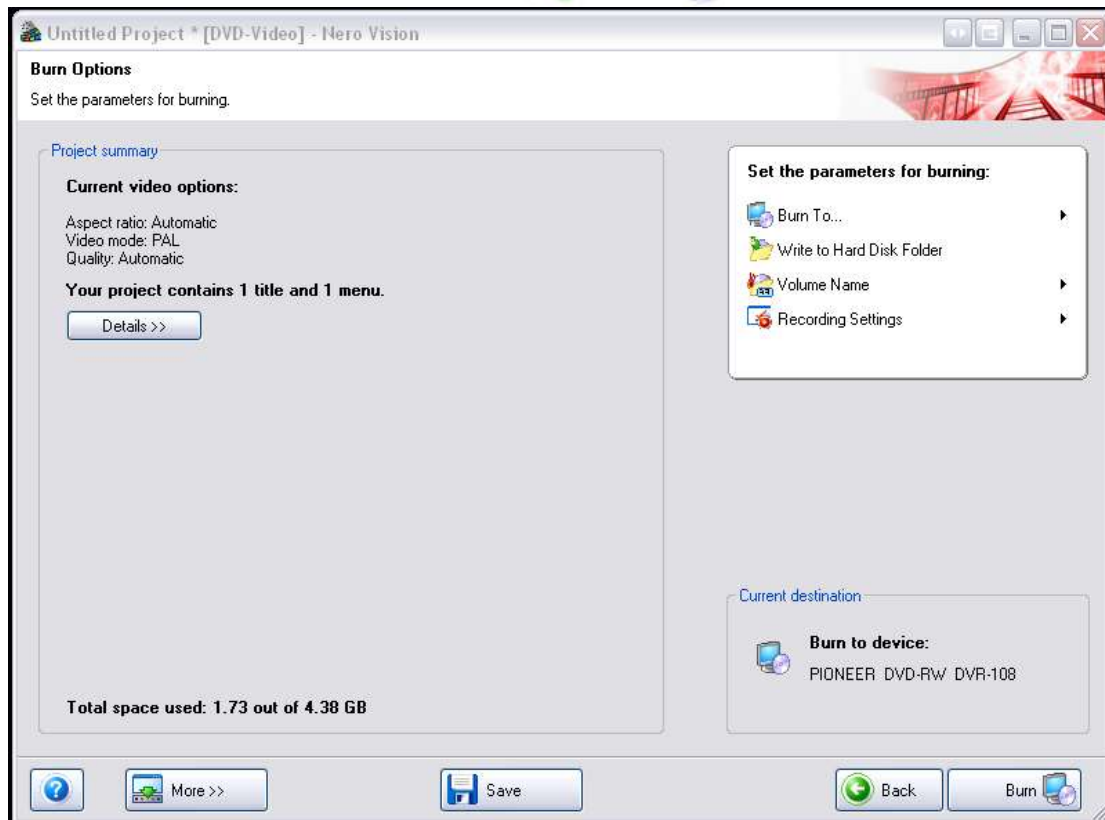


1. This is where you choose what this front part that people will see. To get what I have below I will tell you what I did and then you can work this out for yourself how you like things to appear.
2. **LAYOUT**: Layout 1
3. **BACKGROUND**: What ever you like the look of
4. **BUTTONS**: Because it's a movie I choose DVD_Button_2 cos it looks like a movie reel.
5. **FONT**: I leave the same. Too much mucking around
6. **HEADER/FOOTER TEXT**: This is what people see when the movie starts, so it's a good idea to name it to either the name of the movie, event etc... ☺
7. **SHADOWS**: Yeah leave this as well if you want
8. **AUTOMATIZATION**: This mean either the person will have to start the movie themselves by clicking with their remote or you can set it to play the movie and set the delay time: usually 30seconds
9. **INTERACTION COLORS**: Pass... another that I leave alone – cos I'm lazy.
10. Once you are happy with what you have done – oh you can drag things about on the screen and put them where you want them, click **NEXT**

You can test your movie and how it looks with this screen by pressing the play button on the remote control. If you like how it all looks and works press **next**.



Obviously with this one, you are ready to encode and burn the disk. This is where you add a DVD to your DVD Rom/Burner.

After the disk has been inserted, make sure the **recording setting** is set to either **12x or 16x**, depending on your burner and of course the disks that you are using. Most disks these days are 16x. Remember, it's always better to burn slower to ensure a good burn than fast and waste your time and disks. **I usually burn at 12x, no faster**

Once all that is done, click **burn**.

Now this is the important part... **DO NOT** use the computer whilst this process is happening. Apart from the fact that your computer will be extremely slow, you can actually fault the process by asking the computer to work too hard.

Test the DVD in a DVD player (Before you go ahead and burn heaps) and if all goes well, to duplicate that disk again, use **Nero copy DVD**.
